

A Hopeful Tomorrow

The History Of Hope

Sometimes it’s the things in life we lack that make us the most thankful. Bryan and Leslie Shoffner, like most North Carolina parents, don’t have children facing life-threatening illnesses. And for that, these proud parents of four count their blessings. However, a few years ago, when Bryan’s daughter suddenly had a rising fever of 103 degrees and became listless and non-responsive, he drove her to North Carolina Children’s Hospital. Bryan quickly learned about the Hospital and the miraculous work its staff and faculty were doing day in and day out for so many children in need. After his experience, Bryan discovered that each year more than 60,000 children from all 100 North Carolina counties make over 200,000 visits to North Carolina Children’s Hospital, which includes a comprehensive children’s outpatient center and 136 inpatient beds in a child-friendly, family-focused environment.

After his positive experience at the Hospital, he vowed that one day he would find a way to contribute. That day has come.

In late 2007, Bryan Shoffner, president of Shoffner Construction, decided to build homes within The Hamptons, an upscale Chatham County community being developed by Windjam Development. He soon realized that the community presented the perfect opportunity: he would create a dream home with all proceeds benefiting N.C. Children’s Hospital.

Knowing that every dollar saved on construction would impact children and families in need, Bryan began securing discounted and donated building materials with the help of the community’s developer, Rex Vick, Jr., CEO of Windjam Development.
